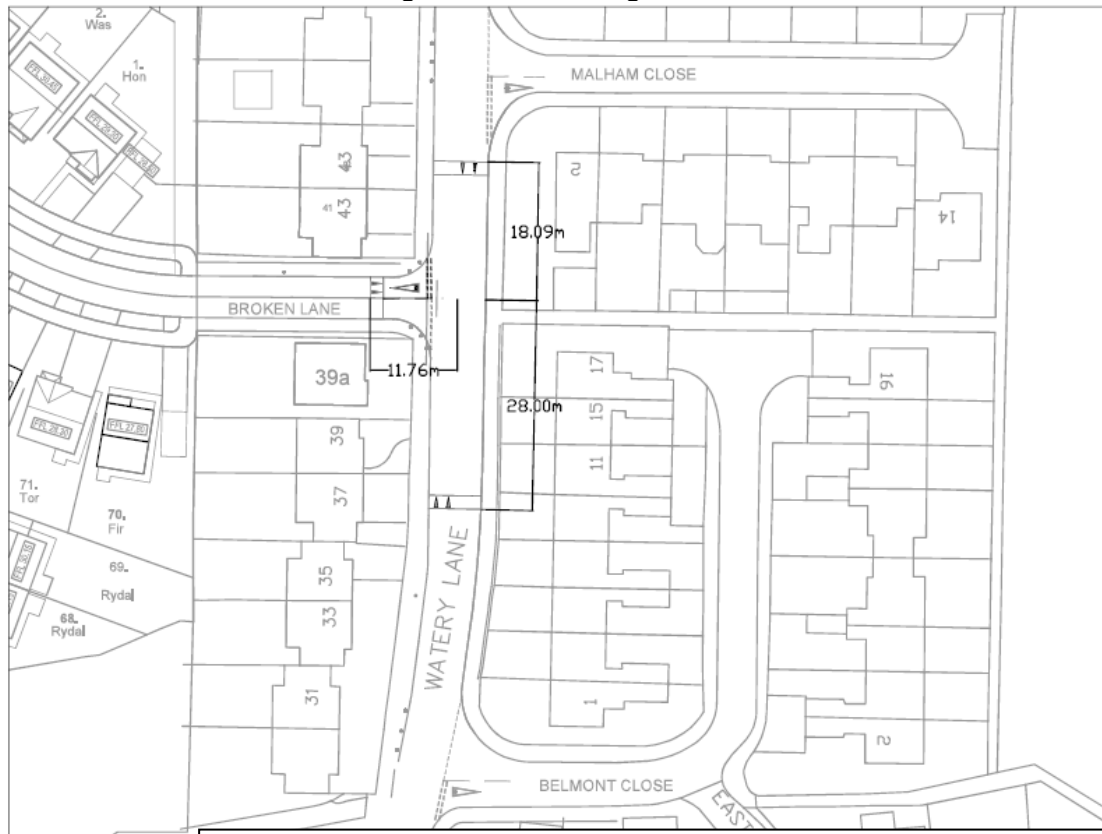


**NOTICE OF PROPOSAL
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(BROKEN LANE AND WATERY LANE, LANCASTER,
LANCASTER CITY) (JUNCTION TABLE)**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with Section 90A of the **Highways Act 1980**, Lancashire County Council propose to introduce a junction table in the following locations:

- Watery Lane, Lancaster, from the intersection of the centreline of Broken Lane and Watery Lane for a distance of 18.09 metres in a northerly direction;
- Watery Lane, Lancaster, from the intersection of the centreline of Broken Lane and Watery Lane for a distance of 28 metres in a southerly direction;
- Broken Lane, Lancaster, from the intersection of the centreline of Watery Lane and Broken Lane for a distance of 11.76 metres in a westerly direction.

The junction table will have a maximum height not exceeding 75mm.

Statement of Reasons

The proposals are being pursued as part of a s278 Agreement under the Highways Act 1980 as part of a new development which will introduce further traffic movements.

The purpose of the raised junction table on Watery Lane is to slow traffic and allow safe passage of pedestrians due to the increase in traffic from the new housing development.

These proposals are being funded by the developer.
