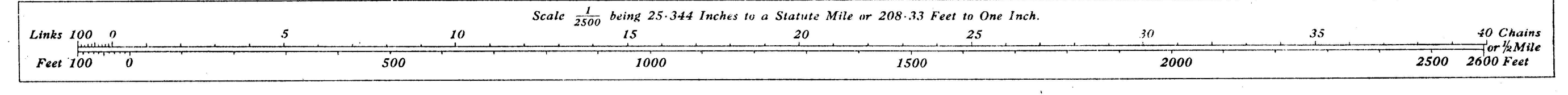

The Altitudes of Bench Marks and surface heights are given in Feet above the mean level of the sea at NEWLYN, and are based on the new primary levelling of 1912-21. To refer these to the obsolete Liverpool datum, add to the figures shown—0.3—feet. Note that the figure applies to this plan only and is only approximate to 0.1 ft. Further information on application.

Altitudes indicated thus (B.M. 51.17) refer to bench marks on buildings, walls, &c., those marked (+) preceded or followed by the height to surface levels.

Note—To convert Decimal parts of an Acre into Rods and Perches, multiply by 4, this will give Rods and Decimals of a Rod, multiply this Decimal by 40 thus obtaining Perches and Decimals of a Perch.

N.B.—The representation on this map of a Road, Track, or Footpath, is no evidence of the existence of a right of way.



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
