He returned to school in Lancashire as a Deputy Headteacher, again responsible for Assessment before returning to the Assessment Team after 5 Years.

Mike is a Senior, Key Stage 2 Moderator and is responsible for planning moderation practices in this phase. He was also EYFS and Key Stage 1 Moderator prior to these assessments becoming non-statutory.
