This supplement provides details of Community, Voluntary Controlled, Voluntary Aided, Foundation and Academy Primary Schools in the Hyndburn, Ribble Valley, Burnley, Pendle and Rossendale areas. The policy for admission to Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools can be found on page 4.

For Voluntary Aided and Foundation Schools and Academies a summary of the admission policy is provided in this booklet under the entry for each school. Some of these schools may operate different admission arrangements and you are advised to contact individual schools direct for clarification and to obtain full details of their admission policies.

These criteria will only be applied if the number of applicants exceeds the published admission number. A full version of the admission policy is available from the school and you should ensure you read the full policy before expressing a preference for the school.

Where the school has a nursery class, the number of nursery pupils is in addition to the number on roll.

How do infant school to junior school transfers work? (Year 2 to Year 3)

In Lancashire, there are 5 infant and 5 junior primary schools. These are separate establishments but are closely linked.

These are:-

- Ribbleton Avenue Infants and Ribbleton Avenue Juniors (Preston)
- Leyland Methodist Infants and Leyland Methodist Juniors (South Ribble)
- Leyland St Andrew's CE Infants and Woodlea Juniors (South Ribble)
- Rosegrove Infants and Lowerhouse Juniors (Burnley)
- Whitefield Infants and Lomeshaye Juniors (Pendle)

If the junior school is able to admit all Year 3 applicants, then this will be arranged locally and will automatically happen each September. If, however, there are more applicants for Year 3 than available places (and anybody may apply for a Year 3 place – including new to area families), then a formal admission round will take place using the determined admission criteria (please see above).

For these pairs of schools, the sibling criterion will be applied across the full age range ie Reception to Year 5 for Reception and Year 3 admissions, and reception to Year 6 for in-year requests

In the event that during the period specified for attendance at worship the churches have been closed for public worship and have not provided alternative premises for that worship, the requirements of these admissions arrangements in relation to attendance will only apply to the period when the churches have been available for public worship.

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Each Lancashire Primary School and Academy has a published admission number which confirms its number of reception admissions each September.

These will, on occasion, increase where strategic place planning issues allow and/or where decisions can be implemented in time for the effective co-ordination of the admission process.

Admission Criteria for Community & Voluntary Controlled Schools

When a school is oversubscribed on parental preferences, then the following priorities apply in order:

- Looked after children or a child who was previously looked after, but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangement order, or special guardianship order or those children who appear to the school to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted, then,
- 2. Children for whom the Local Authority accepts that there are exceptional medical social or welfare reasons which are directly relevant to the school concerned, then,
- 3. Children eligible for services premium, then,
- 4. Children with older brothers and sisters attending the school when the younger child will start, then,
- 5. Remaining places are allocated according to where a child lives. Those living nearest to the preferred school by a straight line (radial) measure will have priority.
 - The distance criterion which will be used as the tie breaker if there is oversubscription within any of the admission criteria; is a straight line (radial) measure.
 - If the Local Authority is unable to distinguish between applicants using the published criteria (eg. siblings, those living the same distance from home to school, or families residing in the same block of flats) places will be offered via a random draw.
 - The distance measure is a straight-line measurement (radial) between the applicant's home address points and the address point of the school (co-ordinates provided by ordnance survey data).

When a primary school with a GPA is oversubscribed the following priorities will be applied in order:

- 1. Looked after children or a child who was previously looked after, but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangement order, or special guardianship order or those children who appear to the school to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted, then,
- 2. Children for whom the Local Authority accepts that there are exceptional medical social or welfare reasons which are directly relevant to the school concerned, then,
- 3. Children eligible for services premium, then,
- 4. Children living within the school's geographical priority area with older brothers and sisters attending the school when the younger child will start, then,
- 5. Children living within the school's geographical priority area, then,
- 6. Children living outside the school's geographical priority area with older brothers or sisters still attending the school when the younger child will start, then,
- 7. Children living outside the school's geographical priority area.

The distance criterion which will be used as the tie breaker if there is oversubscription within any of the admission criteria is a straight line (radial) measure. If the Local Authority is unable to distinguish between applicants using the published criteria (e.g. twins or same block of flats), places will be offered via a random draw. The distance measure is a straight line (radial) measure centre of building to centre of building.

Please register your eligibility - even if you don't want to take up the free meals - so that the school can access this extra funding.

To be eligible you must be receiving one of the benefits listed below:

- Universal Credit with a household income of less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income-Based Jobseekers' Allowance
- Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, not entitled to Working Tax Credit and household income less than £16,190
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Guarantee element of state pension Credit
- Income Support
- Working Tax Credit 'run on' the payment you receive for a further four weeks after you finish work

If you are receiving one of the above benefits, please ring the Area Education Office on 01254 220747. They can do an immediate online check for you.

We only require your name, date of birth and national insurance number to do this.

Please note, you still need to register your child with us even if you have an older child already attending school and receiving free school meals.

Definitions for Voluntary Aided & Foundation Schools & Academies for Admission Purposes

The following terms used throughout this booklet are defined as follows, except where individual arrangements spell out a different definition.

DISTANCE

The 'straight line' method of measurement only applies for admission purposes / For transport 'walking routes' are used to determine distance.

PARENTS / FAMILY MEMBERS

A parent is any person who has parental responsibility or care of the child. Where admission arrangements refer to 'parent's attendance at church' it is sufficient for just one parent to attend. 'Family members' include only parents and siblings.

MEDICAL/SOCIAL/WELFARE

Where schools have a medical/social/welfare admission criterion then this should take into account the circumstances of the child and the family. Please note the Local Authority information in the main admissions booklet.

LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN AND PREVIOUSLY LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN

The School Admissions Code [December 2014] states that within the oversubscription criteria, the highest priority **must** be given to looked after children and children who were looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order). This includes children who appear to the school to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted Relevant, legal documents must be provided to evidence the adoption.

A 'looked after child' (1) or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption (2) child arrangements order (residency order) (3) or special guardianship order (4).

- (1) A 'looked after child' is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989) at the time of making an application to a school.
- (2) This includes children who were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 (see section 12 adoption orders) and children who were adopted under the Adoption and Childrens Act 2002 (see section 46 adoption orders).
- (3) Under the provisions of s.12 of the Children and Families Act 2014, which amend section 8 of the Children Act 1989, residence orders have now been replaced by child arrangements orders.
- (4) See Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 which defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians).

Admission Authorities for faith schools may give priority to all looked after children and previously looked after children whether or not of the faith, but they must give priority to looked after children and previously looked after children of the faith before other children of the faith. Where any element of priority is given in relation to children not of the faith they must give priority to looked after children and previously looked after children not of the faith above other children not of the faith.

Catching the school bus

Please behave sensibly and responsibly when travelling to and from school for your own safety. If you misbehave you may have your travel pass taken away or be excluded from using school bus services.

- Be at the stop 5 minutes before.

 Queue sensibly and keep well away from the kerb. Give a clear signal so the bus driver knows to stop. Make sure you are boarding the bus at the correct stop.
- Pay your fare and try to have the correct change. Keep your ticket to show the inspector and/or for your return journey.
- If you use a bus pass/season ticket, it must always be presented to the bus driver allow time for it to be examined. Bus passes/season tickets are not transferable and should only be used on the service for which they are assigned. If you cannot show a valid pass you must pay your fare. Lost or damaged passes can be replaced for a fee by contacting the County Council on 0300 123 6738.
- Misuse and fraudulent use of travel passes is treated very seriously and could lead to prosecution.
- Take your seat, please wear a seat belt if one is provided. Don't take up more than one seat. Place bags in the luggage compartment/under your seat/on your knees. Don't place bags on seats or in the aisle.
- If all seats are taken, you should stand sensibly behind the driver area and use grab rails where available. You should not stand adjacent to emergency exits, on staircases or upstairs on a double deck vehicle. Do not walk around during the journey.

- Antisocial behaviour/damage to the bus or anyone's property/bullying on the bus, is taken very seriously and can be reported to the police. Please report incidents to the driver, a teacher or a parent. Do not throw anything whilst on the bus, at the bus or from the bus
- All bus and taxi services have No Smoking Policies including all e-cigarettes and vaping devices.
- 9 Respect others at all times and never distract your driver.
- Make sure you know which stop you are getting off at and to alert the driver by pressing the bell only once or asking them to stop at the next bus stop.

Never override past the bus stop you have paid for. Overriding could lead to prosecution.

- When leaving the bus please take the time to thank your bus driver.
- Remember to take all of your belongings when you leave the bus.
- Let the bus depart before crossing the road. Find a safe place to cross and remember: Stop, Look and Listen.
- DO NOT text/use your mobile phone when crossing roads. Remove ear accessories to allow you to hear any oncoming traffic.
