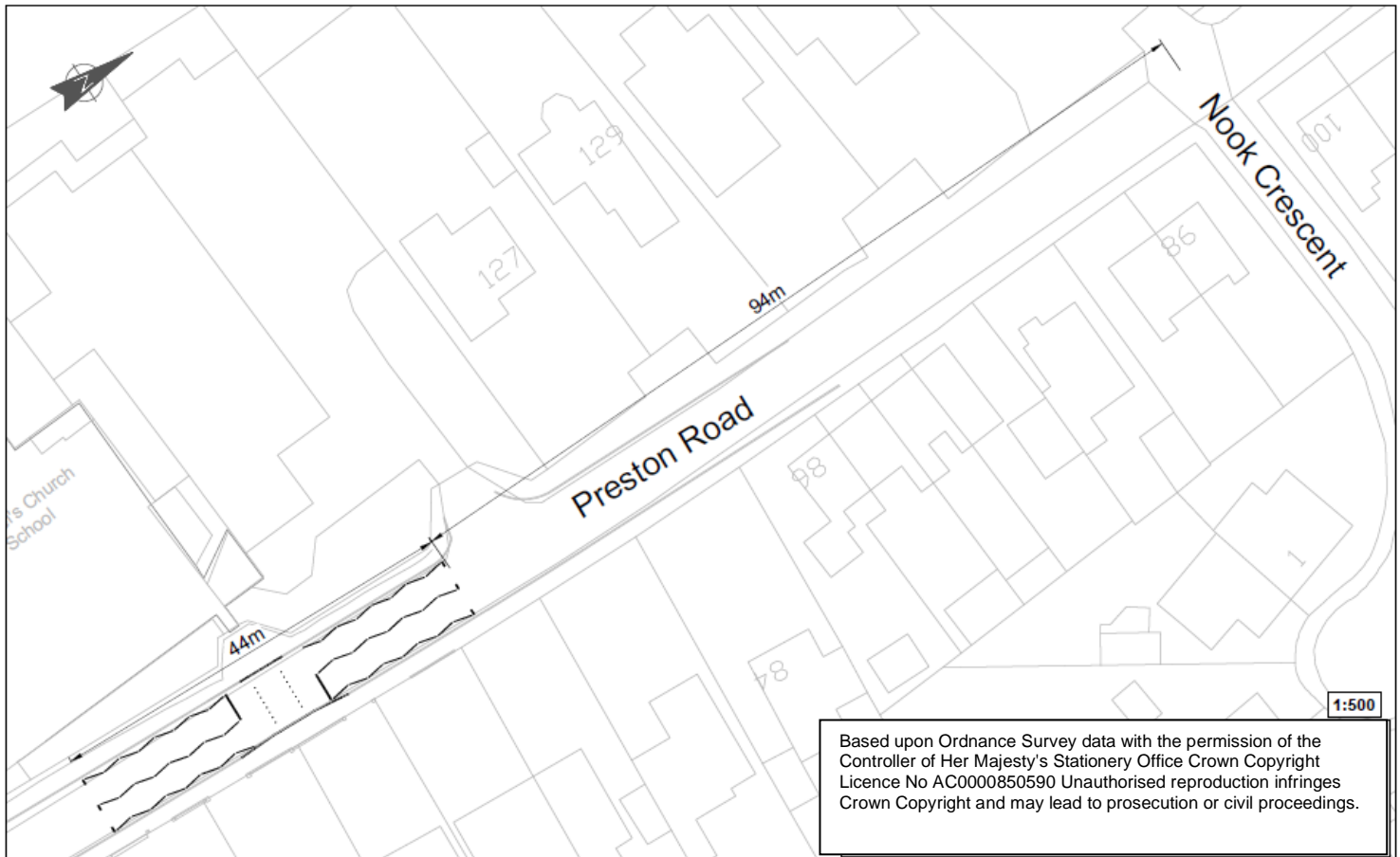


NOTICE OF PROPOSAL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(PRESTON ROAD, GRIMSARGH, PRESTON CITY) (PEDESTRIAN
CROSSING)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above pedestrian crossing under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to introduce a puffin crossing in Preston Road, Grimsargh, from a point 94 metres southwest of its junction with the Centreline or Nook Crescent for a distance of 44 metres in a south westerly direction.



Statement of Reasons

This proposal is connected with the Grimsargh Bridge Widening scheme which is part of the larger BSIP programme. The email address for comment on the scheme is BSIP@lancashire.gov.uk and there is a website detailing the proposals.

The purpose of the introduction of a new pedestrian crossing adjacent the Primary School is to provide a safe place for pedestrians to cross the carriageway. This is in anticipation of increased vehicle speeds due to the proposed widening of Grimsargh Skew Bridge.
