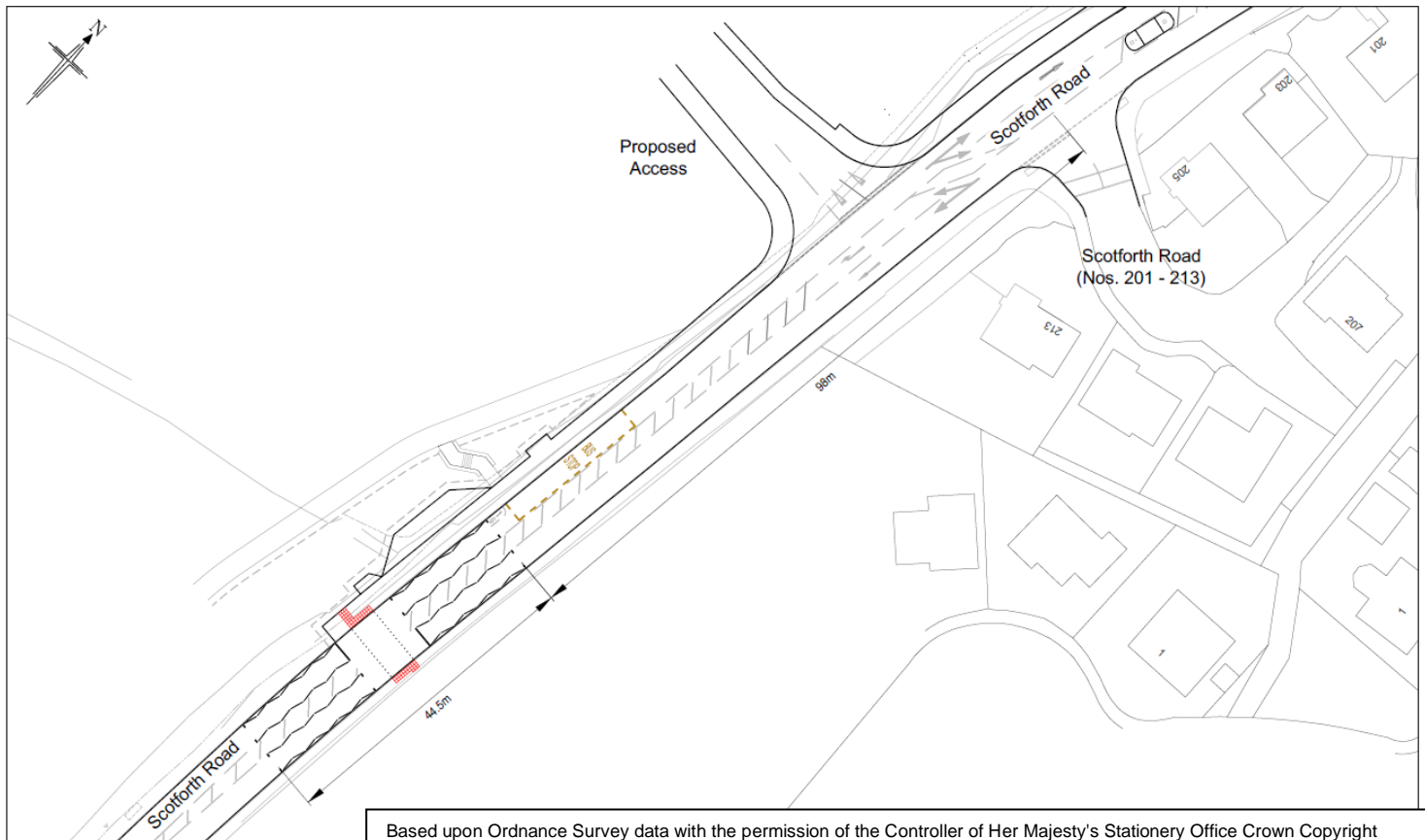


**NOTICE OF PROPOSAL**  
**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**  
**LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL**  
**(SCOTFORTH ROAD, LANCASTER, LANCASTER CITY)**  
**(PEDESTRIAN CROSSING)**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above pedestrian crossing under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to introduce a puffin crossing in Scotforth Road, Lancaster, from a point 98 metres south of its junction with the centreline of Scotforth Road (Nos 201-213) for a distance of 44.5 metres in a southerly direction.



**Statement of Reasons**

The purpose of this proposal is to introduce a puffin crossing on Scotforth Road, Lancaster, to provide safer road crossing facilities for pedestrians between the proposed development and the proposed bus stops on the eastern side of Scotforth Road.

The proposals are being pursued as part of a Section 278 Agreement under the Highways Act 1980 as part of a new housing development on the West side of Scotforth Road to improve pedestrian links to the east side of Scotforth Road.
