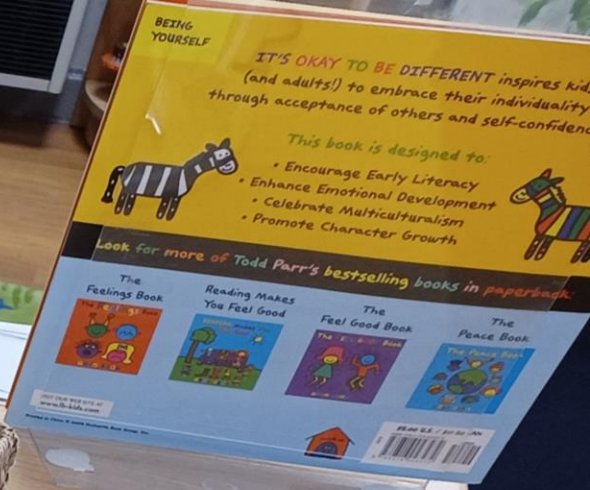

Balance the eggs with the flour.



Put the flour in the bowl.



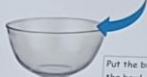
Balance the eggs with the sugar.



Put the sugar in the bowl.



Balance the eggs with the butter.



Put the butter in the bowl.



Add the eggs to the bowl.



Mix, mix, mix!



Put the mixture in a baking tray.

Cook at 180° C for 15 minutes.



Decorate your cake and eat it!

How to make Playdough

- Combine plain flour and salt.
- Add water and oil.
- Mix until ingredients are combined.
- Knead well.



Playdough Ingredients

- 2 cups of plain flour
- 1 cup of salt
- 1 tablespoon of oil
- 1 cup cold water

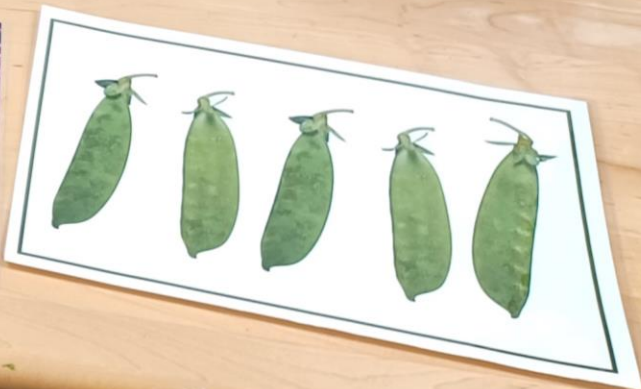
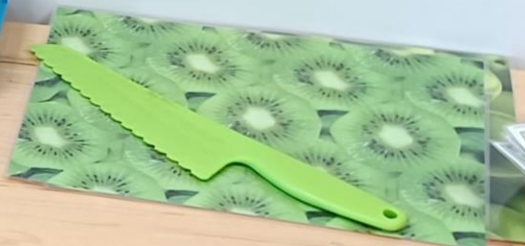

Recording a child's story: the Journey Stick

A journey stick is a multisensory way of recording a journey: drawing at the bottom of the stick, we attach things we collect along the way, including notes (with adult help) about what we see, hear and smell.

This is great for Early Years practitioners, children to draw marks of their surroundings, and for collecting things and stories to share their learning.

Children can then use what they have collected on the stick as prompts to retell the story of their journey. We covered one stick in a house, then used it to tell us a story about a house in the village.
