

**NOTICE OF PROPOSAL**  
**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**  
**LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL**  
**(BROADWAY, HOLME STREET AND SAGAR STREET, NELSON, PENDLE**  
**BOROUGH) (REMOVAL AND INTRODUCTION OF PEDESTRIAN**  
**CROSSING)**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that Lancashire County Council propose the following under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended:

1. Remove a puffin crossing in Sagar Street, Nelson, from a point 15.2 metres west of its roundabout junction with Netherfield Road for a distance of 42.2 metres in a westerly direction.
2. Introduce a parallel crossing in the following lengths of road:
  - a) Sagar Street, Nelson, from its roundabout junction with Broadway for a distance of 24.2 metres in a southerly direction;
  - b) Broadway, Nelson, from its roundabout junction with Sagar Street/Holme Street for a distance of 32.6 metres in a westerly direction;
  - c) Holme Street, Nelson, from its roundabout junction with Broadway for a distance of 20.2 metres in a northerly direction.
