
NOTICE OF MODIFICATION
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(GORSEY LANE, HIGH STREET, NEW STREET AND
SMITHY LANE, MAWDESLEY, CHORLEY BOROUGH)
(ROAD HUMPS)



**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that Lancashire County Council proposed the above road humps in accordance with Section 90A of the **Highways Act 1980**. Following consultation carried out between 05 December 2023 and 02 January 2024, it is now intended to modify the proposal as titled above, as set out below:

## Remove the following speed humps:

- a) Gorsey Lane, Mawdesley, from a point 10.56+ metres southeast of its junction with the Centreline of High Street/New Street for a distance of 7 metres in a south easterly direction.
- d) Smithy Lane, Mawdesley, from a point 10.73 metres northwest of its junction with the Centreline of High Street / New Street for a distance of 7 metres in a north westerly direction.



## **Statement of Reasons**

Following the objections from the Parish Council the location of the road humps was reconsidered and the road humps on Smith Lane and Gorsey Lane can be removed as the speed reduction would not be significant as vehicles already need to stop at the junction and the priority at the junction is not changing. The road humps on New Street and High Street are considered necessary to reduce vehicle speeds along New Street and High Street as this is a through route.
