
NOTICE OF PROPOSAL
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(DARLINGTON STREET, HEWLETT AVENUE AND HEWLETT STREET,
COPPULL, CHORLEY) (JUNCTION TABLE)



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with Section 90A of the **Highways Act 1980**, Lancashire County Council propose to introduce a junction table in the following locations:

- a) Darlington Street, Coppull, from a point 7.3 metres north to a point 7.4 metres south of its junction with the intersection of Hewlett Street and Hewlett Avenue;
- b) Hewlett Street, Coppull, from the intersection of the centreline of Darlington Street and Hewlett Avenue for a distance of 9.6 metres in an easterly direction;
- c) Hewlett Avenue, Coppull, from the intersection of the centreline of Darlington Street and Hewlett Street for a distance of 9.3 metres in a westerly direction.



Statement of Reasons

The purpose of the raised junction table at the junction of Hewlett Street is required to slow traffic and allow safe passage of pedestrians due to the increase in traffic from the new housing development These proposals are being funded by the developer of the site through a Section 278 Agreement.
