2	Footpath	Footpath commences at junction of St. John's Road and Stonemoor Bottom and runs in a westerly direction until it reaches Fennyfold Farm, it turns north here and runs in a northerly direction until it passes out of the Urban District. It is an ash road and runs to the farm without interruption; ditch and hedge on southerly side of road and fence on northerly side for 500 feet and then hedge on either side until reaching the Farm. Runs through farmyard and continues to Urban District Boundary; this length from Farm to Boundary is in bad condition due to flooding, but is undergoing repair. Used by public for at least 60 years and repaired by Urban District Council from time to time. (Reference Ordnance Sheet No. Lancs. LX111.4 Edition of 1893).	0.43
3	"	Footpath commences at Urban District Boundary at junction with No. 2. Approximately 6ft. 0in. wide ash path in fair condition, runs in roughly a north-easterly direction until it meets the junction of Footpath No. 4 having a fence on the south-easterly side and the steep bank of the River Calder on the north-westerly side. No stiles, gates or obstructions throughout the length. Used by the public for at least 60 years. Repaired by the Urban District Council from time to time (Reference Ordnance Sheet No. Lancs LX111 4. Edition of 1893)	0.29
4	"	Forms continuation of Mare Park Road and joins Footpath No. 3 Ash path running South-south-east between allotment fences with no gates, stiles or obstructions in its length. Path maintained by the Urban District Council and in good condition.	0.06

6	Footpath	Footpath commences at southerly end of Mare Park Road and commencement of Footpath No.4 and runs in an east-north-easterly direction along the boundary wall of the North Western Gas Board Undertaking, with allotment fence on the westerly side and dilapidated iron railings on the easterly side. The path is a wide ash path, and is maintained by the Urban District Council and is in good condition.	0.11	
7	"	Footpath commences on Mare Park Road approximately 20 yards north of Railway Bridge over road. A notice prohibiting the riding of cycles etc. on the path is placed at the commencement of the footpath. From this point the ash path runs roughly in a westerly direction and crosses the River Calder by a steel footbridge adjacent to the Railway Bridge over the River. On the westerly bank of the River, the path turns in a southerly direction, passes through a gap in a wall and along the west bank of the River Calder until meeting Footpath No.9. Used by the public for at least 60 years. Repaired by the Urban District Council from time to time. (Reference Ordnance Sheet No. Lancs LXIII 4. Edition of 1893)	0.11	
8	"	Footpath commences at Stonemoor Bottom, running in an easterly direction from road to Hapton. The path is open both sides and passes out of the Urban District of Padiham through a farm gate adjacent to Spring Cottages. Used by the public for at least 100 years. Reference Ordnance Sheet 63, Edition of 1848.	0.03

10	Footpath	Footpath commences at the westerly end of Station Approach Road, ash path in fair condition runs along foot of railway embankment with iron railings on southerly side and open recreation ground on the northerly side and finally runs into Mare Park Road, no gates, stiles, etc. throughout its length. Used by the public for at least 60 years. and repaired by the Urban District Council. (Reference Ordnance Sheet Lancs. LXIII 4 Edition of 1893).	0.08	
11	"	Footpath commences approx. 2/3 of the way along Footpath No.10 and branches off to the north along a wall side, then turns 90 degrees to the east and becomes a tarmac path in rough condition running between hedge and fence on the northerly side and a dilapidated wall on the south. Used by the public for at least 60 years. (Reference Ordnance Sheet Lancs. LXIII 4 Edition of 1893).	0.10	
16	"	Footpath commences 20 yards east of junction of Victoria Road and Masefield Avenue and proceeds south along the garden fence of 156 Victoria Road for a distance of approx. 34 yds. It turns approx. through 90° and continues in an easterly direction for approx. 100 yds. The path to this point runs between post and wire fences. It then bears in a south-easterly direction with a wall on the south-westerly side and a post and wire fence on the north-easterly side and finally turns south and runs steeply down to Green Brook. A wooden footbridge spans the brook and the U.D. Boundary area gives access to Brook Street.	0.13

17	Footpath	Footpath commencing from Thompson Street. The ash path runs in a north-easterly direction along the wall side of Levant Mill. Bounded in the opposite side by allotment railings. The footpath then crosses a narrow timber footbridge giving access to the easterly end of Canning Street. Used by cars to give access to garages built on the allotment. Maintained from time to time by the Urban District Council. Used by the public for over 60 years. (Reference Ordnance Sheet No.Lancs.LX111 4. Edition of 1893).	0.06	
18	"	Footpath commences at north end of Institute Street with Notice prohibiting the riding of cycles etc.on the path. The path is cobbled and runs between iron railings in an easterly direction for half its length, it then turns through 90 degrees and runs north of the River Calder which is crossed by an iron footbridge (Bentwood Bridge),giving access to the continuation of Lune Street.Notice prohibiting the riding of cycles etc.fixed at the end of footbridge. Path build and maintained by the Urban District Council.	0.13	
19	"	Footpath commences at the junction of Footpath No.18 and the continuation of Ingham Street, and runs in an easterly direction through fields, along banks of River Calder,to U.D. Boundary at junction with Footpath 28 (Parish of Northtown Burnley R.D.).Access given by farm gate and stile, for 700 ft.the path is a wide ash track. Used by the public for at least 60 years.(Reference Ordnance Sheet No.Lancs LV1.13 Edition of 1893)	0.13

In the course of the path are two very small streams which are crossed by simply stepping over. Used by the public for at least 60 years. (Reference Ordnance Sheet No.Lancs.LX1.13 Edition of 1893).	0.25	
21	"	G.R.F.Commences at the end of the paved portion of Grove Lane and carries on in a north-easterly direction bounded by a hedge on the northerly side and a fence on the southerly side, which gives way to a wall through the wood. The road is used by cars and carts from the farm and is in fair condition. Used by the public for over 100 years.(Reference Ordnance Sheet No.55, 6 in. to 1 Mile Edition of 1848). Repaired jointly by the Urban District Council and Gawthorpe Estate.	0.39	
22	"	Footpath joining Footpaths Nos.20 and 21 at a point where footpath No.20 enters Grove Lane plantation and running north to join Footpath No.21. Wide concrete path in excellent condition.	0.03

23	Footpath	Footpath commences at east end of Quarry Street open at road end, runs between allotment fences to wide farm gate with stile at side. Road continues at side of fence and continues on to Middle Field Farm. Used by the public for over 100 years (Reference Ordnance Sheet No. 55, 6 in. to 1 mile, Edition of 1848).	0.16	
24	"	Footpath branching off from Footpath No. 23 about 100 yards from farm. Runs alongside fence to wooden stile. Over the stile the path is in rather muddy condition. Path bears to the left about half way through field and through hedge by low stile with no step, cuts across corner of field and through squeezer stile. Path crosses next field to iron gate set in bank marking the Urban District Boundary. Used by the public for over 100 years (Reference Ordnance Sheet No. 55, 6 in. to 1 mile, Edition of 1848)	0.25	
25	"	Footpath branches from footpaths No. 30 in a north-easterly direction and runs across pasture land and terminates at wide farm gate in Hargrove Farm Yard. Used by the public for over 100 years. (Reference Ordnance Sheet Lancs. No. 55, 6 in. to 1 mile, Edition of 1848)	0.10	
26	"	Footpath commences at junction of Footpaths 25 and 30 at a wooden stile in fence, runs in a south-westerly direction, between two blocks of houses and gives access onto Windermere Road. Used by the public for over 100 years. (Ref. Ordnance Sheet No. 55, 6 in. to 1 mile, Edition of 1848).	0.07

27	Footpath	Footpath commences at junction of Footpaths No.28,29 and 30, and runs across pasture lands in a north-north-easterly direction crosses hedge by means of a stile and continues until reaching the N.W.By-Pass Road B.6247 at a point approx. 210 ft.S.W. of the U.D.Boundary. Access to the road is gained by a gate and stile. Used by the public for over 100 years.(Reference Ordnance Sheet Lancs. No.55,6 in.to 1 mile, Edition of 1848).	0.20	
28	"	Footpath commences in Higham Road (B.6247) just West of Old Moss Farm. A wide ash road runs in a southerly direction until reaching the N.W.by-pass where it passes through a gate to gain access to the road. The path re-commences via a gate on the southerly side of the by-pass road and runs between hedges and turns East just before joining footpaths 27 and 30. The road is known locally as Guide Lane and has been used by the public for over 100 years. (Ref.Ord.Sheet Lancs.No.55 6" to 1 mile Edition of 1848).	0.17	
29	"	Footpath continuation of Guide Lane from junction with footpaths No.27 and 30 until reaching Hargrove Farm. Well defined ash path. Used by the public for over 100 years. (Reference Ordnance Sheet Lancs No.55, 6 in. to 1 mile, Edition of 1848).	0.05

Access from Guide Lane by wooden stile. Used by the public for over 100 years.(Reference Ordnance Sheet No. Lancs.55,6in.to 1 mile, Edition of 1848).	0.09	
31	"	Footpath commences at end of unadopted street leading from Slade Lane B.6247, over a squeezer stile set in hedge, the path then runs in an easterly direction along hedgeside until meeting Footpath No.28 (Guide Lane). Access to which is given by a squeezer stile. Used by the public for at least 60 years.(Reference Ordnance Sheet No.Lancs.LV.16, Edition of 1893).(In two halves - separated by Padiham N.W.By-Pass Road).	0.15	
32	"	The footpath commences at the Southerley end of Inkerman Street and runs diagonally down steep bank of River Calder for approx. 450 ft. At this point the path diverges slightly from the original line due to erosions of the embankment and subsequent collapse of original path. The path passes through the line of the boundary wall of Memorial Park. Traces of the wall and barbed wire fence remain, but the path is not obstructed. From this point the path runs through the trees and overhanging shrubbery and continues more or less parallel to the river until it joins footpath No.7 at the footbridge.	0.21

33	Footpath	Footpath commences on Blackburn Road A.678, at Stirken Hills Farm. Wide gate at main road always open. Track runs in a southerly direction past side of farmhouse and barn to gate. Past gate, track runs through field at hedge side until reaching allotments, passes through allotments and under railway arch and then fades out. No evidence of path ever continuing. Path through allotments maintained by the Urban District Council.	0.13	
34	"	Footpath commences on Whalley Road, A.671, near Craggs Farm. Wide path running past farm and then between two high hedges, the path is much overgrown by grass and the hedges, and is strewn with many stones. A farm gate and stile give access to pasture lands and path runs alongside hedge in a westerly direction, at end of hedge path turns sharply south and passes on and out into Blackburn Road, A.678, by means of farm gate and wicket gate at side. Small gate in bad condition due to lack of hinges. Used by the public for at least 100 years. (Reference Ordnance Sheet No.55, and 63 Edition of 1848)	0.44

35	Footpath	<p>Footpath commences approximately $\frac{1}{3}$rd of the way along Grove Lane. Entry is given from Grove Lane by a farm gate and a squeezer stile. The path, which is ill defined then runs alongside the hedge in a north-north-westerly direction to another stile approximately 25 yards south of Middlefield Farm. The path then runs in a westerly direction and joins Footpath No. 24. Used by the public for at least 60 years. (Reference Ordnance Sheet No. Lancs LV1 13, Edition of 1893).
