# Something to do this week! Review your safeguarding children arrangements

Take some time to consider how well the protection of children is working in your setting. You might be a childminder working on their own, a small pre-school or a large nursery or school - protecting children from abuse or neglect will always be a priority.

#### Consider if you and your team (if applicable):

Know the possible signs of abuse and neglect

- Are well supported by the setting's Designated Lead Practitioner
- Are clear on when to make a referral
- Know where to go to for advice (inside or outside your setting/school)
- Know where to make a referral

#### What does good safeguarding of children look like?

<u>The Early Years Inspection Handbook</u> (Paragraph 59) states that 'All early years providers should have an open and positive culture around safeguarding that puts children's interests first. This means they:

- protect children from serious harm, both online and offline
- are vigilant, maintaining an attitude of 'it could happen here'
- are open and transparent, sharing information with others and actively seeking expert advice, when required
- ensure that all those who work with children are trained well so that they understand
  their responsibilities and the systems and processes that the provision operates and are
  empowered to 'speak out' where there may be concerns
- actively seek and listen to the views and experiences of children, staff and parents, taking prompt but proportionate action to address any concerns, where needed

Have appropriate child protection arrangements, which:

- identify children who may need early help, and who are at risk of harm or have been harmed. This can include, but is not limited to, neglect, abuse, grooming, exploitation, sexual abuse and online harm
- secure the help that children need and, if required, refer children in a timely way to those who have the expertise to help
- manage safe recruitment and allegations about adults who may be a risk to children
- are receptive to challenge and reflective of their own practices to ensure that safeguarding policies, systems and processes are kept under continuous review'

### **Let's Celebrate!**

This week we are shouting a magnificent Wednesday Well Done to two Childminders in Lancashire who have recently has their Ofsted inspection reports published.

Flenny Duncan from Burscough was credited in her report with the inspector noting 'The childminder has a good understanding of how children learn and develop. Overall, she uses this knowledge alongside children's interests to plan a broad and interesting curriculum. The childminder understands how to sequence children's learning'

Jen shared that she really enjoyed her morning with the inspector and she made her feel so relaxed. In the call, the inspector had told Jen that any activity should be simple with no "frills or bells" and to have any parent feedback ready. The inspector asked about CPD and how this has helped Jen move forward with her practice. Jen's Top tip is to keep it simple and be confident.

Jessica Bowden from Buckshaw Village shared that her inspection went very well. Jessica said the inspector was really friendly and didn't ask many questions as Jessica feels this was covered in their discussions. Jessica had made lunch in the slow cooker that day to make it easier and had also written down a list of the things she wanted the inspector to know since her last inspection. Jessica notes how reading through this the night before helped. The inspector noted how- 'Children's independence is promoted well. The childminder and her assistant encourage children to build on what they already know and can do. Children practice their developing skills, such as dressing themselves for outdoor play.'

Jessica's top tip would be to sell yourself.
