

Thank you for your letter dated 16th April 2014, please can you confirm whether you wish your letter to be treated as a statutory objection to the Order?

I have spoken with the Rights of Way Officer dealing with matter and she has provided a response to the points you have raised.

In deciding whether it is appropriate to maintain an objection following receipt of an application under Schedule 14 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act the County Council were legally required to investigate the matter and that an Order was subsequently made because only part of the route of the public footpath from Sandyforth Lane to Lightfoot Green Lane had been recorded on the Definitive Map and because the part that had been recorded was incorrectly shown.

The County Council carried out detailed research to identify the correct route of the full length of the public footpath and consulted relevant landowners at various stages of the process. The research led the County Council to make an Order to delete from the Definitive Map the route shown on the Order plan by a solid black line between points A-B-C-D and to add to the Definitive Map the correct historical route of the footpath shown as a thick dashed line between points A-E-F-G.

The Order does not seek to create a new public footpath but to rectify mistakes that were made when the footpath was originally recorded on the Definitive Map.

The Order has been made based on the documentary evidence which (when viewed as a whole) shows the correct route of the footpath to be the route A-E-F-G.

It is understood that in recent years the footpath has received very little use. On the ground access onto the route is available (and signposted) from Sandyforth Lane at

point A and it is possible to walk across the rugby pitch to point E. However between point E to point G the Order route follows a line along what is now the edge of the football pitch/golf driving range and has partially been obstructed by a line of Leylandii trees and fencing. It exits onto Lightfoot Lane at point G – currently through a garden gate belonging to yourself.

The County Council understand you have serious concerns about the safety of pedestrians exiting onto Lightfoot Lane However, issues relating to public safety, the current use of the land over which the route passes and existence of alternative (and possibly more suitable alternative routes) cannot be taken into account when considering whether the Order to record the correct route of the footpath should have been made and whether it should be confirmed.

If the Order is confirmed the County Council will then need to consider how best to open up the public footpath so that it can be used by the public. This will involve discussions with yourself, the owners of the rugby club, the football club and the golf driving range with regards to the current obstructions and to the safety of the public using the route. At this stage it will be possible to consider what precautions may be necessary at the exit onto Lightfoot Lane and whether a better route could be provided for the public if the footpath was to be legally diverted onto a different alignment.

We note that you have previously explained that before the football pitch was constructed there was a gate directly opposite the entrance to a farm on Lightfoot Lane (east of point G) and that you believed that this was the correct exit point of the footpath onto Lightfoot Lane. We have looked at the evidence, and whilst not doubting the existence of the gate referred to by yourself we believe that the historical route of the public footpath exited the field at point G and that it was never legally diverted to exit onto the lane via the gate.

Thank you for your letter which the Council received on 14th May 2014. I have now had chance to speak with the Environment Directorate and provide you with a response below.

With regards to the current use of the rugby pitches by the Salmesbury Longbow Archery club I will ask for this to be investigated further as it already has an implication on the use of the route currently recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement as Broughton Public Footpath 3 between points A-B on the Order map.

However, such use at the current time (or in the future) cannot be taken into account when considering whether the Definitive Map Modification Order should be confirmed.

Would you please note that the County Council are not doubting that a farm gate existed opposite the entrance into the farm on Lightfoot Lane and it is actually possible that use of this route by the public may actually mean that an alternative route to that contained within the Order (which exits onto Lightfoot Lane at point G) may have legally come into existence at some point in the past. However, the County Council is not in receipt of an application requesting that this route be recorded as a public footpath and we do not have sufficient map, documentary of user evidence to make an Order for this route.

If you do wish to make an application to record this additional route as a public footpath it would be necessary for you to gather the evidence pertaining to it and submit an application. Guidance notes and application forms are attached. However, please be advised that any application received would be treated separately to this Order that you are currently objecting to.

This particular Order is based on historical evidence as detailed in the attached Committee report. It is the Councils opinion that the map and documentary evidence

supports the view that historically the route of the public footpath exited the field in the corner at point G and I would refer you specifically to the Tithe Map 1840, 25 inch Ordnance Survey maps published in 1893, 1911, 1932 and 1939 and the aerial photograph from the 1960s.

It was noted in the Committee report that in more recent times there may have been a gate existing opposite Lightfoot House Farm - as the route of the footpath is shown differently on the 1978 25 inch OS map. The existence of a gate is also noted on the map forming part of the Planning Application submitted in respect of the golf driving range in 1989. However, there is nothing to suggest that the original route (exiting at point G) had been legally diverted to pass through this gate.

The fact that the Order route at point G is now partially obstructed is irrelevant when considering whether the public footpath historically existed along the Order route and should the Order be confirmed the practicalities of opening up the legal line of the path will be discussed with yourself and other affected parties.

I would be grateful if you would reconsider your stance in view of the comments made and the information provided in the Committee report.

I look forward to hearing from you in due course.
