Further to your letter received today, we confirm that an inspector can access our property to inspect the footpath

We have an increasing problem with this footpath with dog walkers entering via the stile and exercising dogs off the line of the footpath on the children's playing fields and leave dog foul on the pitches. As you are no doubt aware dog excrement poses a health risk to children. In addition walkers seem to think there is a right of way through our land to Lightfoot Green Lane. We feel it would now be in our interested to have this footpath stopped or diverted away from the playing field. We would be happy with the deletion ABCD but not the reinstatement AEEG

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Dear Richard,

Thank you for your e-mail.

Please note that the County Council are required to refer the DMMO to the Secretary of State for determination as it seeks to rectify a drafting error and to record the route of the public footpath on the correct historical alignment.

Whilst the concerns regarding dog fouling are understandable this issue is not relevant to the confirmation of the Definitive Map Modification Order. Once the issue regarding the correct alignment of the route is resolved (i.e. the Order is determined by the Secretary of State) it would be possible for the rugby club to apply to legally divert the public footpath around the edge of the playing field and this may help to alleviate the problem but only if it was possible to ensure that dog walkers kept to the path and kept their dogs under close control. I have attached guidance notes regarding the procedure to divert a public footpath for your information.

If you have not already done so, it may be worth talking to Preston City Council about whether it would be possible to provide dog bins or signage at the start of the footpath from Sandyforth Lane.
