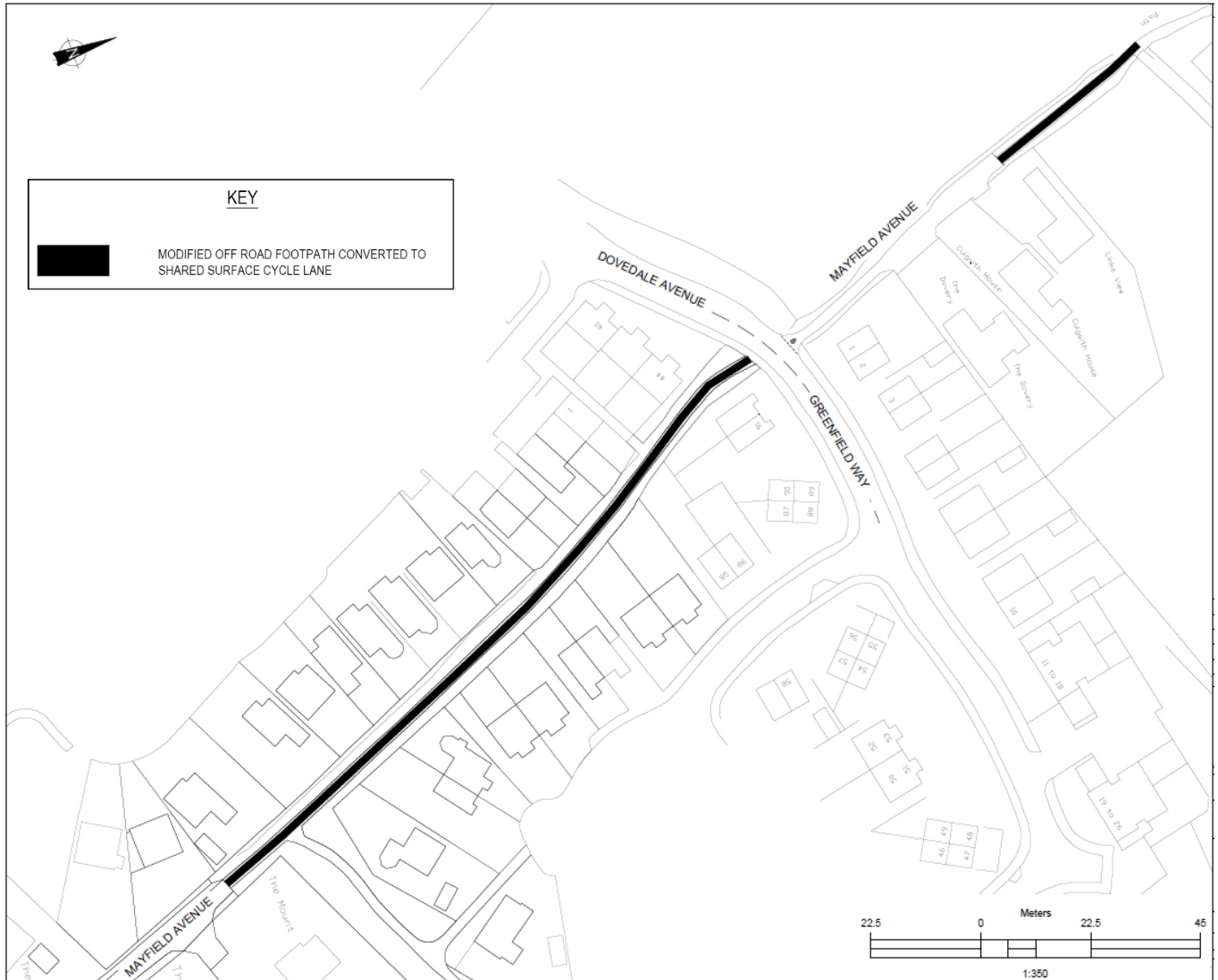


**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that in accordance with Section 65(1) and 66(4) of the Highways Act 1980 Lancashire County Council propose to convert the following lengths of footway to joint use cycle tracks:-

- 1) Mayfield Avenue (F7491), Fulwood, from its junction with Dovedale Avenue/Greenfield Way for a distance of 152 metres in a southerly direction;
- 2) Dukes Meadow to Mayfield Avenue Link (F7421), Fulwood, from a point 55 metres north of its junction with Dovedale Avenue/Greenfield Way for a distance of 42 metres in a northerly direction.



### Statement of Reasons

The proposals are being pursued as part of a Section 278 agreement under the Highways Act 1980. These proposals are being funded fully by the developer and are linked to planning application for the new housing development and associated planning conditions. The purpose of the proposed shared cycle-way is to upgrade and improve sustainable transport links and to support social inclusion. Street lighting is being installed along the shared cycle-way to provide in the interest of safety and to make the route more desirable for all users.
