Take it outdoors and hunt for some dandelions.



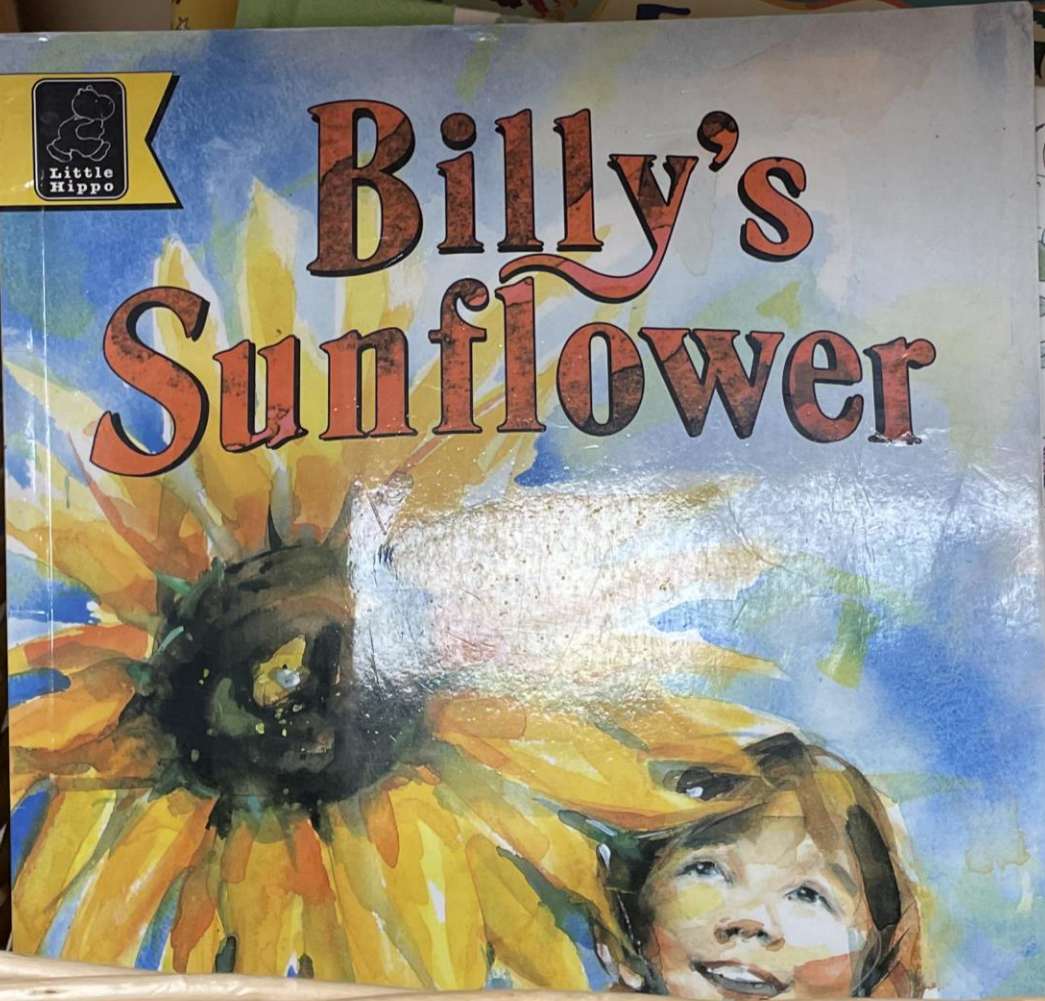
How many can you spot?

Non-native bluebells

- straighter stem
- cone shaped bell
- paler colours of the petals
- petals flare at the edges
- bells on both side of the stem
- not much scent
- pollen is a green or blue colour
- wider leaves

It is illegal to pick a bluebell or uproot one on purpose.

It can take years for bluebells to grow once planted.

White bluebells are incredibly rare in the native variety.

Native bluebells have a sweet smell.
