Job Purpose

The role is to:

- Register or conduct statutory and non-statutory ceremonies at registration offices, religious buildings and other approved premises within the local authority
- To undertake duties attached to the registration of marriages and civil partnerships

Accountabilities / Responsibilities

- Register or conduct marriages and civil partnerships, carry out all related duties and responsibilities in compliance with the Registration Acts.
- Travel to venues across the county in order to meet the needs of the ceremony programme
- Have sole responsibility for the secure custody of all legal paperwork and security stock for the duration of their duties including the confidentiality of information contained therein
- Keep up to date on all emergency and contingency procedures set by the service; ensuring all personal lists, plans and relevant equipment are current in accordance with the service standards.
- Undertake all corrections, administrative duties and online registrations in accordance with the Councils guidelines and procedures.
- Be aware of own responsibilities in security of stock, handling sensitive and confidential information and wider role in preventing counter fraud and public protection
- Commitment to continuing professional development
- Keep up to date on changes in legislation, policies and procedures
- Contribute positively to the overall improvement, development and promotion of the service.
- Regular attendance at monthly team briefings
- Requirement to work flexibly outside of agreed working pattern on occasions
- Good teamwork and communication skills with celebrant, ceremonies officers and responsible persons at approved venues

In addition to the accountabilities/responsibilities described above the post holder may be required to undertake additional equivalent or lower graded role as appropriate

Other

- **Annualised hours**
Work patterns are agreed in advance in accordance to the needs of the service but caveat that there may be occasions when the officer is required to work outside of this pattern. This could be due to unexpected circumstances such as a surge in demand for ceremonies or unforeseen staff shortages. In such instances, Registration Officers – Ceremonies, working in a statutory role will be invited to step in, even if it falls outside their usual agreed working pattern.
- **Workplace**
You may be required to work at other locations and the role may involve some lone working
