

NOTICE OF PROPOSAL
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(MARKET STREET, SHAWFORTH, ROSSENDALE) (BUS
STOP CLEARWAY (1) (2500DCL5645 + 25001416))



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council propose to introduce a Bus Stop Clearway at any time (the effect of which will be to prohibit the stopping of vehicles) in the following lengths of road:

- 1) Market Street, Shawforth, the west side, from a point 3.6 metres north of its junction with the centreline of Quarry Street for a distance of 27 metres in a northerly direction;
- 2) Market Street, Shawforth, the east side, from a point 4 metres north of its junction with Eagley Bank for a distance of 27 metres in a southerly direction.

Statement of Reasons

This proposal is to support the implementation of accessibility improvements at bus stops within the East Lancashire area. These improvements form part of a wider initiative to provide safe and suitable boarding and alighting facilities for all passengers, including wheelchair users, pushchair users, and individuals with restricted mobility who rely on public transport services.

The introduction and alteration of Bus Stop Clearway markings are necessary to ensure that stopping areas remain free of parked vehicles. Vehicles parking within or adjacent to bus stops can obstruct bus manoeuvring space and limit forward visibility, creating additional difficulties for drivers and for visually impaired passengers. The proposed clearways will therefore provide unobstructed access for buses and support safe and efficient passenger movement.

Where required, additional infrastructure such as bus shelters and raised boarding platforms will be installed to enhance safety, comfort, and accessibility at the stops.

Bus Stop Clearways

SHAWFORTH, Chapel (by) Stop ID 2500DCL5645; and
SHAWFORTH, Chapel (opp) Stop ID 25001416

This proposal will upgrade the existing bus stop to a Quality Bus Stop Clearway, ensuring buses can pull in and out safely and consistently.

The implementation of the Bus Stop Clearway will ensure that appropriate enforcement measures can be undertaken, thereby improving compliance and delivering benefits for all road users, including pedestrians.
