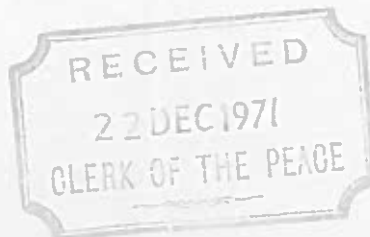
The Certificate and plan have been enrolled amongst the records of Quarter Sessions in accordance with Section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959.

Highways Act, 1959 - Section 108 and 12th Schedule

I have to inform you that at Clitheroe Magistrates' Court on the 16th December, 1971, applications by Lancashire County Council and Clitheroe Borough Council to stop up certain lengths of Chatburn Old Road, Clitheroe, and adjacent footpaths were granted by my Justices.

The Orders, however, do not authorise the stopping up of these lengths of road and footpaths until the new part to be substituted therefor has been completed satisfactorily and a certificate to that effect has been signed by two of my Justices and transmitted to you.

An Order under Section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, in respect of each application and a plan of the area signed by the Chairman of the Court are enclosed.

PETTY SESSIONAL DIVISION OF CLITHEROE

BEFORE the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Sessions Room, King Street, Clitheroe.

APPLICATION having been made by Sir Patrick McCall, Clerk of the Lancashire County Council, that on the 19th day of November, 1971, NOTICE was given that the Lancashire County Council, being the Highway Authority for the highways hereinafter mentioned, intend to apply to the Magistrates' Court for the Clitheroe Petty Sessional Division of the County of Lancaster sitting at the Sessions Room, King Street, Clitheroe, Lancashire, on Thursday the sixteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seventy one at ten o'clock in the forenoon for an Order under Section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, authorising the stopping up of the lengths of highway specified hereunder : -

1. That length of Chatburn Old Road which extends from a point approximately 285 yards west of the junction with Clitheroe Road for a distance of approximately 50 yards in a westerly direction.
2. That length of Footpath No. 13 from a point approximately 285 yards west of the junction with Chatburn Old Road and Clitheroe Road for a distance of approximately 50 yards in a westerly direction.
3. That length of Footpath No. 1 which extends for a distance of approximately 150 yards in a westerly direction from its intersection with Footpath No. 13.
4. That length of Footpath No. 14 which extends from a point approximately 359 yards north of its junction with Chatburn Old Road for a distance of approximately 66 yards in a north westerly direction.

AND the Court being satisfied that the Applicant has given the Notices required by Part 1 of the Twelfth Schedule to the Highways Act, 1959.

AND the Court having heard the Applicant.

~~AND the written consent of the Lancashire County Council has been obtained, and the authority of every person having a legal interest in the land which is to be stopped up, having been obtained, and the same has been deposited with the Clerk of the Court.~~

AND the Court being satisfied that the said highways are unnecessary.

IT is hereby ordered that the said highways be authorised to be stopped up for the purpose of all traffic.

(PROVIDED that this Order does not authorise the stopping up of any part thereof until the new part to be substituted therefor has been completed to the satisfaction of two Justices of the Peace for this Petty Sessional Division and a certificate to that effect signed by them has been transmitted to the Clerk of the Peace for the said County).

APPLICATION having been made by John Cowdall, Town Clerk and Chief Executive Officer of the Borough of Clitheroe that on the 19th day of November, 1971, NOTICE was given that the Clitheroe Borough Council, being the Highway Authority for the highways hereinafter mentioned, intend to apply to the Magistrates' Court for the Clitheroe Petty Sessional Division of the County of Lancaster sitting at the Sessions Room, King Street, Clitheroe, Lancashire, on Thursday the sixteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seventy one at ten o'clock in the forenoon for an Order under Section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, authorising the stopping up of the lengths of highway specified hereunder: -

1. That length of Chatburn Old Road which extends from a point approximately 208 yards north east of the junction of West Bradford Road and Pimlico Road for a distance of approximately 292 yards.
2. That length of Footpath No. 4 which extends from Chatburn Road near Park House Bridge for a distance of approximately 320 yards in a north westerly direction.
3. That length of Footpath No. 4 which extends for a distance of approximately 166 yards in an easterly direction from a point on Chatburn Old Road approximately 208 yards north east of the junction of West Bradford Road and Pimlico Road.
4. That length of Footpath No. 3 which extends for a distance of approximately 80 yards north east from the intersection of Footpath No. 4 and for a distance of approximately 112 yards south west from the intersection.

AND the Court being satisfied that the Applicant has given the Notices required by Part 1 of the Twelfth Schedule to the Highways Act, 1959.

AND the Court having heard the Applicant.
