

NOTICE OF PROPOSAL

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

**(ECROYD STREET, JOHN STREET AND QUIN STREET, LEYLAND,
SOUTH RIBBLE BOROUGH) (JUNCTION TABLE)**



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with Section 90A of the Highways Act 1980, Lancashire County Council propose to introduce a junction table in the following locations:

- a) Ecroyd Street, Leyland, from its centreline junction with John Street for a distance of 54.3 metres in a south westerly direction;
- b) John Street, Leyland, from its centreline junction with Ecroyd Street for a distance of 20.4 metres in an easterly direction;
- c) Quin Street, Leyland, from its junction with John Street/Ecroyd Street for a distance of 7.6 metres in a northerly direction;
- d) Quin Street, Leyland, from its junction with John Street/Ecroyd Street for a distance of 8.1 metres in a southerly direction;
- e) Access Road to Car Park, Leyland, from its junction with Ecroyd Street for a distance of 6.2 metres in a northerly direction.

The junction table will have a maximum height not exceeding 75mm.

Statement of Reasons

South Ribble Borough Council is prompting the transformation and improvement of Leyland Town Centre. The aims are to create a new vibrant heart to the town and a business hub development incorporating workspace, events and skills including dedicated office accommodation.

Phase 1 of the scheme includes the relocation of an existing car park on Ecroyd Street and the construction of new dwellings.

These works are being pursued as part of a Section 278 agreement under the Highways Act 1980 associate with the Leyland Town Centre Improvement scheme.

The proposals include the introduction of a raised junction table to encourage self-enforcement of the speed limit, thereby enhancing highway safety for all users, improving pedestrian safety, and reducing the impact of additional traffic generated by the new development.
