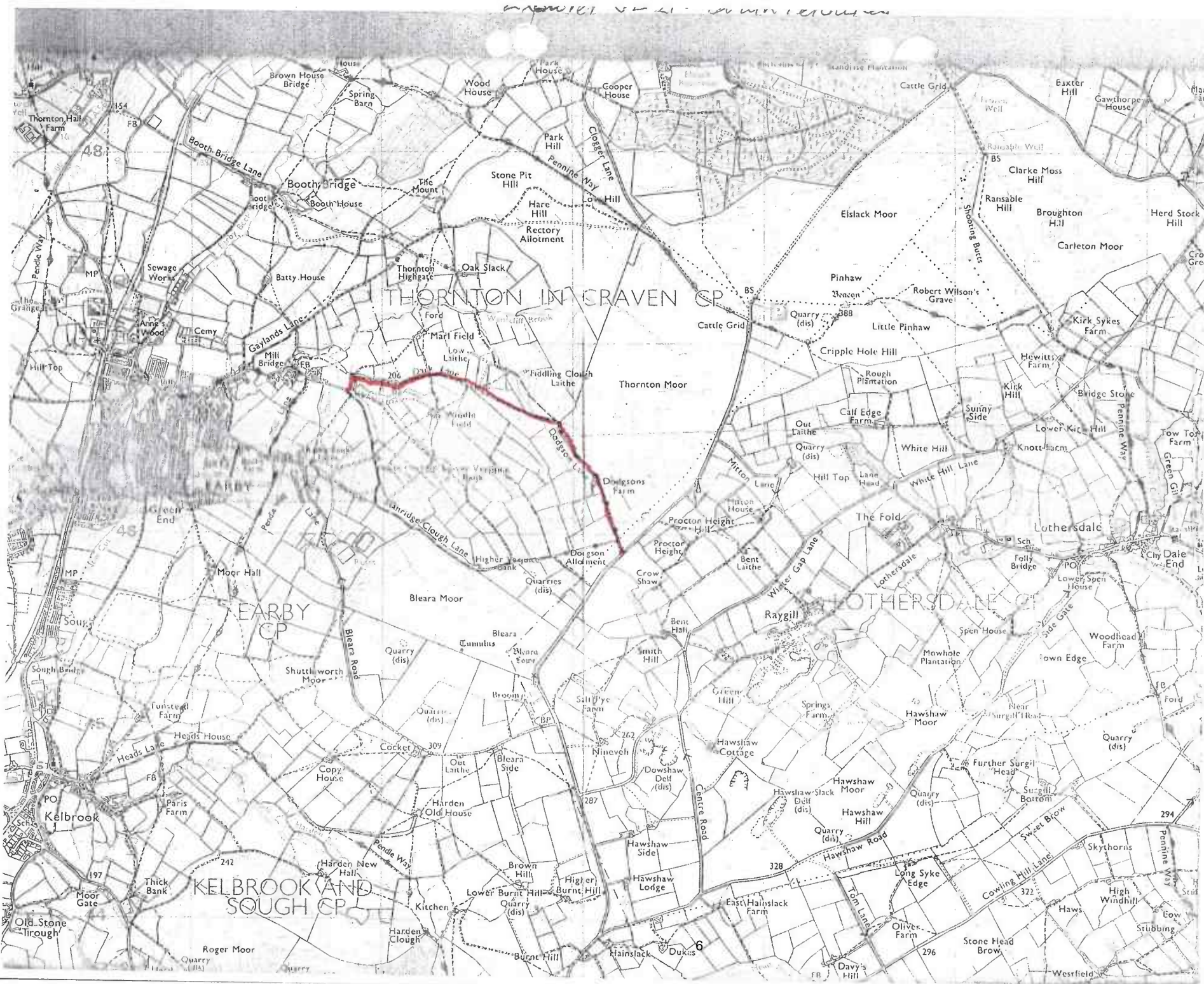

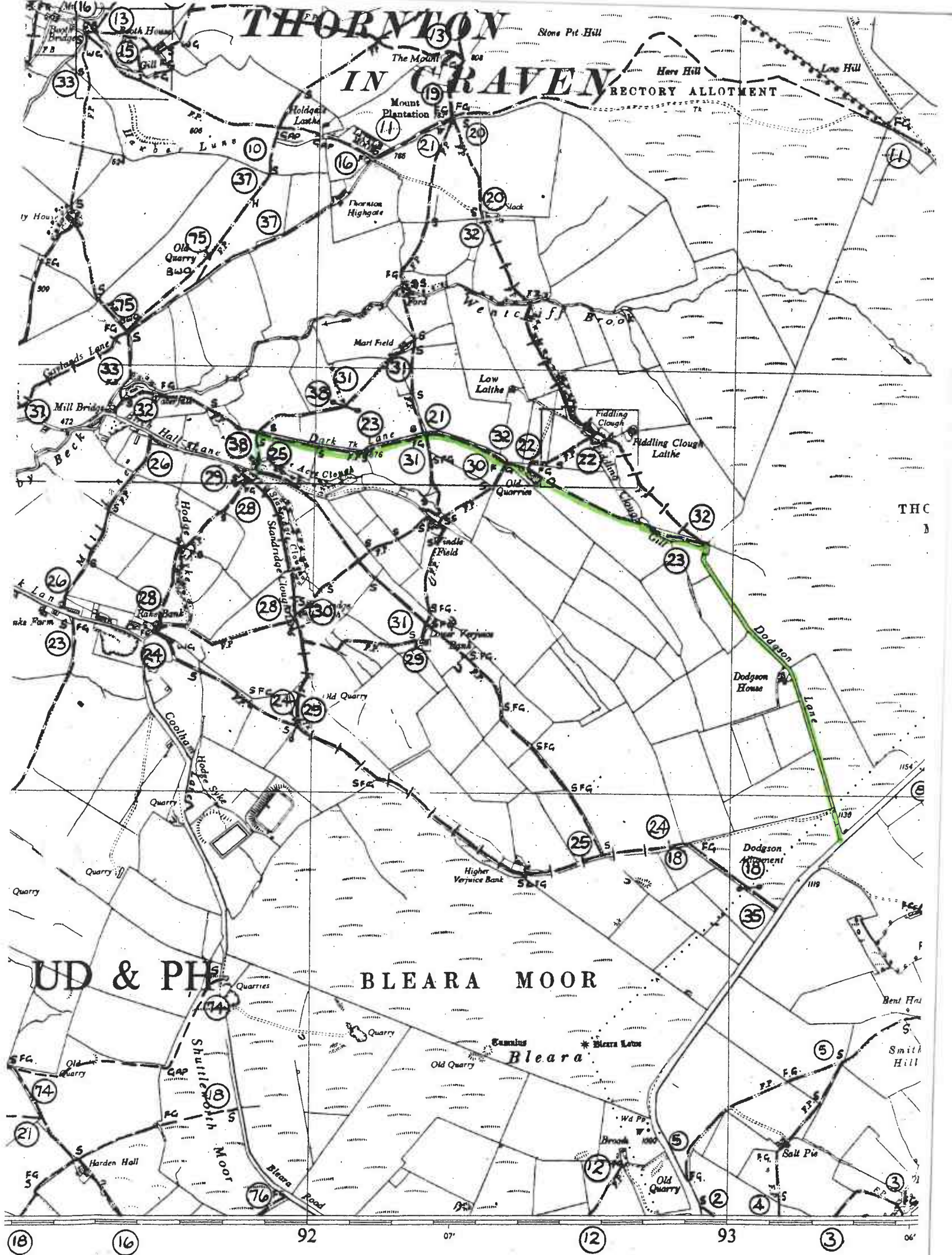

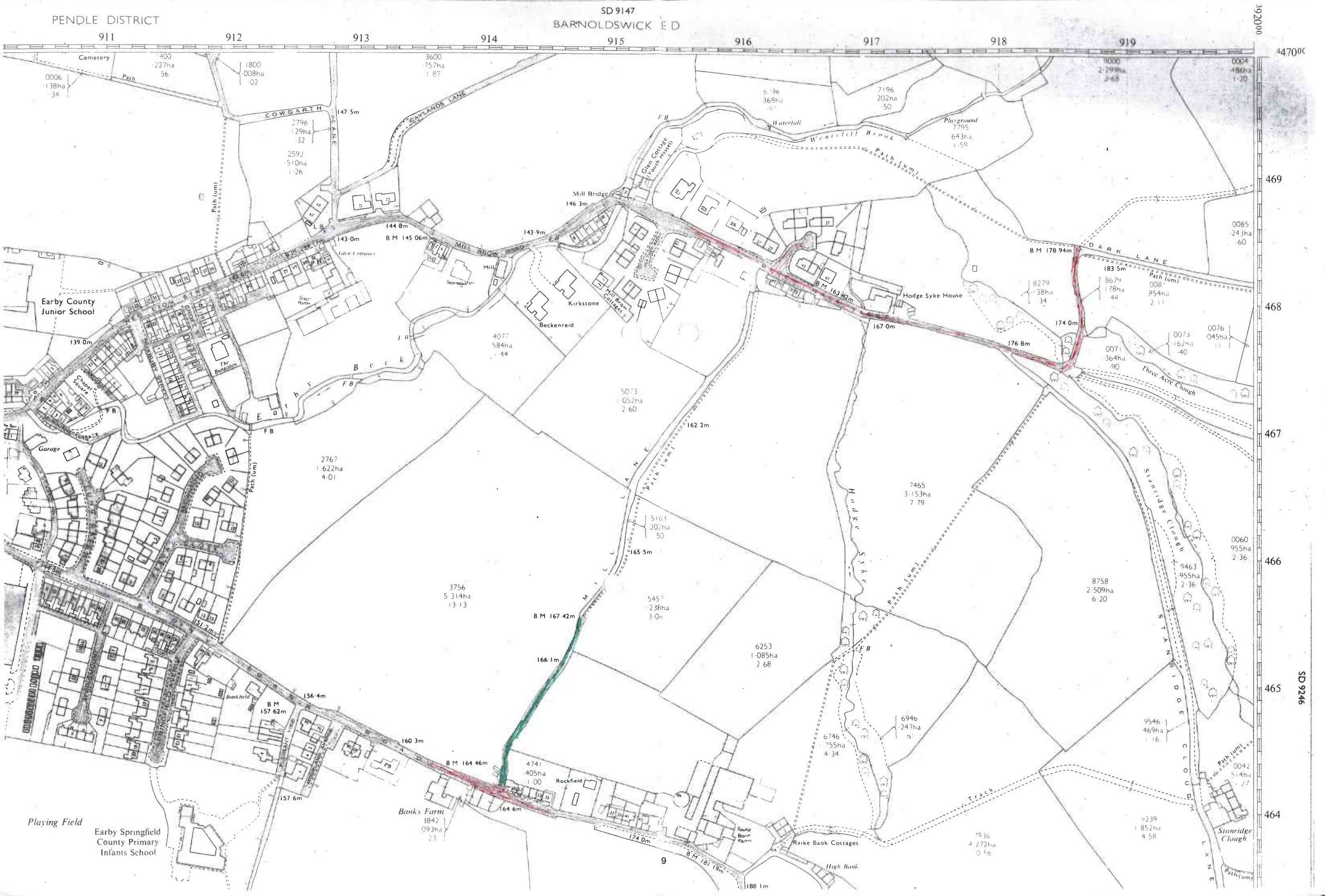

PARLIAMENT made and passed in the fifty ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George
the third intituled "AN ACT for inclosing and exonerating from tythes lands in the parishes and
of Thornton in Craven in the County of York" I was appointed sole Commissioner for carrying out
allotting and inclosing the said several common moors and waste lands and for carrying out the said
and also a certain other Act made and passed in the forty first year of the reign of His said late
Majesty intituled "AN ACT for consolidating in one Act certain provisions usually made in Acts
of inclosure and for facilitating the mode of proving the several facts usually required in
of such Acts" into execution Subject to the restrictions in the said first recited Act and to the
subject to the rules orders and directions mentioned and contained in the said first recited Act
in such cases where the same are by the said first recited Act (amongst other things) directed
THAT the said

*"The law locks up the man or woman,
Who steals the poor from off the common;
But lets the greater villain loose,
Who steals the common off the poor."*

in such cases where the same are by the said first recited Act thereby varied or altered AND WHEREAS in and by the said first recited Act (amongst other things) IT WAS ENACTED THAT the said Commissioner should and he was thereby empowered to make or cause to be made any new drains ditches or watercourses and to enlarge scour out and widen deepen change the course of and divert all or any of the ancient reservoirs or water brooks drains ditches streams springs watercourses tunnels banks and bridges as well through and over the lands and grounds thereby directed to be divided and inclosed as also in over and through any ancient inclosures in the said parish as to the said Commissioner should seem proper and necessary and should and might deepen and widen any such brooks, streams springs and watercourses as he should think fit or direct and order the same to be done and should and might direct and order the said brooks streams springs and watercourses to be conveyed in such courses and through such land as the said Commissioner should think proper for the purpose of draining any land or supplying any other land with water or straightening any such brooks or watercourses and any other necessary purposes provided that no brook stream spring or ancient watercourse should be diverted or turned without the consent in writing of the owner or proprietor or proprietors of the lands or grounds from whose lands or grounds the same respectively should be intended to be diverted or turned and into whose lands or grounds the same respectively should be intended to be conveyed or turned and the said Commissioner should and he was thereby required in and by his award to order and direct by whom at whose expense at what time and in what manner the said reservoirs brooks ditches drains streams springs watercourses tunnels watergates banks and bridges should be made and thereafter repaired cleansed scoured and maintained AND IT WAS by the said first recited Act FURTHER ENACTED THAT the said Commissioner should and he was thereby empowered and required to set out and allot unto the Surveyors of the Highways for the time being of the several townships within the said parish in such place or places as he should think proper and most convenient for the proprietors of the commons moors and waste lands by the said first recited Act directed to be divided allotted and inclosed such quantity or quantities of the said commons moors and waste lands as he should think proper not exceeding in the whole three statute acres for the use and benefit of all and every person or persons body or bodies politic corporate or collegiate intituled to any allotments on the said commons moors and waste lands for the purpose of getting stones and gravel or other material for making and repairing of the public and private roads and drains of or belonging to the said commons moors and waste lands and all other the public highways bridges tunnels and watercourses within the said parish and also for the fencing and inclosing the allotments to be made therein in pursuance of the said first recited Act and for repairing the ancient and new roads within the said parish AND IT WAS FURTHER ENACTED THAT the said Commissioner should and he was thereby authorised and required in the next place to set out allot and award unto the Lord or Lords of the said Manor of Thornton for the time being as a compensation for his or their rights and interests in and to the said commons moors and waste lands (except lead mines coal mines iron stone or other minerals in and on the same) such part or parcel of the said commons moors and waste lands (quantity quality and situation considered) as should in the judgment of the said Commissioner be qual in value to one sixteenth part thereof AND AFTER RECITING that the old road leading from the village of Thornton to the parish church there had been diverted and that Rachel Smith late of London widow deceased had in her life time erected five alms houses for the accommodation and residence of five poor indigent persons resident in the said parish and a house for the use to the said charity on part of the said old road and upon the waste lands adjoining thereto and that Sir John Lister Kaye Baronet Lord of the said Manor of Thornton had allowed the said Rachel Smith to take a plot of land from his ancient inclosures adjoining or near to the said almshouses containing twenty yards or thereabouts for the enlargement of the grass plot or area in front thereof IT WAS ENACTED THAT the said Commissioner should and he was thereby authorised and

required to set out allot and award so much and such part of the said old road and waste lands had been taken in and made use of in building the said alms houses and also so much more of the waste land adjoining thereto as would be sufficient for the yard and garden to the said alms houses and a convenient road leading to them to the heirs of the said Rachel Smith for the use of the said alms houses for ~~the inhabitants thereof~~

the inhabitants thereof or residents therein for the time being for ever and that the remaining parts of the said old road and also the said waste lands extending from the west side of a gate called the Mastills Gate to the road leading to a place called the Church Hill containing nine hundred yards or thereabouts and also the waste land lying on the west side of the road leading to the yard of the said alms houses and on the north side of the causeway leading to the said Church containing four hundred yards or thereabouts should be set out allotted and awarded by the said Commissioner to the said Sir John Lister Kaye AND IT WAS FURTHER ENACTED THAT the said Commissioner should and he was thereby authorised and required to assign set out and allot and award unto and for Robert Gee as Rector of the said parish and parish Church of Thornton and his successors Rectors of the said parish and parish Church for the time being so much of the said commons moors and waste lands as in the judgment of the said Commissioner the said Rector should be entitled to in respect of his glebe lands in the said parish and his right of common on the said commons moors and waste lands called Thornton Moor therein and hereinafter particularly mentioned and described that is to say A certain plot or parcel of land or ground being part and parcel of the said commons or moors called Thornton Moor adjoining the north east side thereof to other part of the said commons moors and waste grounds called Elslack Moor on the north west side thereof to lands belonging to the said Sir John Lister Kaye in the occupation of John Whitaker and to lands belonging to Harry Alcock Esquire in the occupation of John Slater and John Wilkinson terminating at the east corner of a certain old inclosure called Barefield pasture in the occupation of the said John Slater to the estate of the said Sir John Lister Kaye on the north and to Thornton Moor on the south containing together one hundred and forty acres AND IT WAS PROVIDED AND THEREBY ENACTED AND DECLARED THAT IT should not be lawful for the said Commissioner to allot or set out to and for the said Rector and his successor any greater part or portion of the said plot piece or parcel of land thereinbefore stated to contain one hundred and forty acres than should be an equivalency for his glebe land in the said parish and his right of common on the said commons moor and waste lands thereby directed to be allotted and inclosed until lands tenements or hereditaments in the said parish of Thornton which in the judgment and opinion of the said Commissioner should together with the residue of the said one hundred and forty acres be equal to the value of and a full equivalent for all tythes both great and small moduses compositions and other payments in lieu of tythes arising issuing or payable to the said Rector out of for and in respect of as well the commons moors and waste lands thereby directed to be allotted and inclosed as also out of for and in respect of all homesteads gardens orchards and inclosed lands in the said parish should have been purchased and a proper conveyance or conveyances of such lands tenements or hereditaments should have been made and executed to the said Commissioner for the purpose of being allotted or conveyed to and settled upon the said Rector and his successors in manner by

successors in manner by the said first recired Act directed AND IT WAS FURTHER ENACTED THAT the said Commissioner should and he was thereby required to value all and every the tythes both great and small moduses and compositions or other payments due and payable to the said Robert Gee or the Rector of the said parish and parish Church out of or from all and every the lands and hereditaments within the said parish and should award and fix the value thereof and the said Commissioner should and he was thereby directed and required to set out allot and award unto and for the said Robert Gee as Rector of the Said parish and parish Church of Thornton and his successors rectors of the said parish and parish Church for the time being the residue of the said plot piece or parcel of land containing in the whole one hundred and forty acres thereinbefore particularly mentioned and described after the allotment for glebe and common right should be deducted therefrom as aforesaid in or towards making satisfaction for the said tythes moduses compositions and payments AND IT WAS FURTHER ENACTED THAT in case the said residue of the said plot piece or parcel of land should be insufficient for the purpose of making such compensation for such tythes moduses compositions and payments then it should and might be lawful to and for the said Commissioner within the period limited by the said first mentioned Act but not afterwards to treat contract and agree for and to purchase such lands

to purchase such lands tenements or hereditaments either in one lot or in several parcels in the said parish of Thornton (belonging to any person or persons willing to sell) as in his judgment should be of sufficient value to make up together with the aforesaid allotment a full and adequate compensation to the said Rector and his successors for all such tythes moduses compositions and payments aforesaid and on a proper conveyance or conveyances of such lands tenements or hereditaments being made to the said Commissioner he the said Commissioner should and he was thereby authorised and empowered to pay the purchase money for the same out of the monies to be raised as thereafter mentioned and the lands tenements and hereditaments so purchased should by the Award of the said Commissioner or any separate deed or instrument under his hand and seal be allotted and conveyed to and settled upon the said Robert Gee and his successors Rectors of the said parish and parish church of Thornton aforesaid for the time being for ever and subject to the same or the like uses as the said tythes moduses compositions and payments and such lands tenements and hereditaments when so allotted or conveyed as last aforesaid together with the said allotment thereinbefore directed to be set out allotted and awarded to the said Rector and his successors as aforesaid should be and were thereby declared to be in lieu of and in full satisfaction for all tythes both great and small moduses compositions and all other ecclesiastical dues and other payments whatsoever (surplice fees mortuaries and the other usual Easter offerings paid for communicants due to the said Rector and his successors only excepted) arising growing renewing increasing becoming payable or happening or to arrive grow renew increase become payable or happen within from or in respect of the said common moors and waste lands or any of the ancient inclosed lands tenements or hereditaments within the said parish of Thornton or any of them or any part thereof and the same lands tenements and hereditaments and the allotments made and the land to be sold by virtue of the said first recited Act should be for ever discharged from such tythes moduses compositions and payments accordingly AND IT IS by the said first recited act FURTHER ENACTED THAT the said Commissioner after he should have set out the several allotments therein and hereinbefore mentioned he should sell in manner provided by the said secondly recited Act so much of the residue and remainder of the said common moors and waste lands as should be requisite for paying and discharging the costs charges and expenses of obtaining and executing the said first recited Act and for or towards payment of the purchase money for the lands and tenements to be purchased for the use of the Rector as aforesaid or the whole if necessary under the provisions of the now reciting Act and in case any surplus should remain of the money to arise by such sale after making such payments as aforesaid such surplus money should be divided between the proprietors and persons interested in the lands intended to be hereby divided and inclosed in the manner therein mentioned and the residue of the said commons moors and waste lands should be divided unto and amongst the several persons and parties intituled thereto according to their respective rights and interests AND IT IS by the said first recited Act ENACTED that it should be lawful for the said Commissioner to set out allot and award any lands tenements or hereditaments within the said parish of Thornton in lieu of and in exchange for any other lands tenements or hereditaments within the said parish or within any adjoining parish township or place provided that all such exchanges be ascertained specified and declared in the Award of the said Commissioner and be made with the consent of the owner or owners proprietor or proprietors of the lands tenements or hereditaments which shall be so exchange whether such owner or owners proprietor or proprietors shall be a body or bodies politic corporate or collegiate corporation aggregate or sole or a tenant or tenants in fee simple or for life or in fee tain general or special or by the courtesy of England or for years determinable on any life or lives by and with the consent of the Lessor or Lessors and not otherwise or with the consent of the Guardian Trustees or for charitable or other uses husbands committees or attornies of or acting for any such proprietors or owners as aforesaid who at the time of making such exchange or exchanges should be respectively infants fanes coverts lunatics or under any other legal disability ~~of~~ who should be beyond the law or otherwise

disabled to act for themselves himself or herself such consent to be testified in writing under the common seal of the body politic corporate or collegiate and under the hands of the other consenting parties respectively and all and every such exchange or exchanges so to be made should be good valid and effectual in the law to all intents and purposes whatsoever AND WHEREAS in and by the said Act passed in the forty first year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the third the Commissioner or Commissioners appointed and executing inclosure acts is and are thereby authorised and required before he or they proceed to make any divisions or allotments directed to be made by such inclosure Acts to set out and appoint the public carriage roads and highways through and over the lands and ground intended to be divided and inclosed And the said Commissioner or Commissioners is and are thereby authorised and required to set out and appoint such private roads bridle ways and foot ways as he should think requisite AND WHEREAS the said William Pilkington before I proceeded to act as a Commissioner for executing the said first mentioned Act took and subscribed the oath therein prescribed as appears by the Schedule hereunto annexed and I have in pursuance of the directions of the said Acts heard and finally determined the claims of all the proprietors and persons interested in the said commons moors and waste lands tythes moduses and compositions have in obedience to the direction contained in the said first mentioned Act valued the tythes both great and small moduses compositions and other payments due and payable to the said Robert Gee as Rector of the said parish and parish Church of Thornton out of and upon all and every the lands and premises within the said parish of Thornton at the sum of five thousand five hundred and twenty pounds AND WHEREAS I have set out and allotted unto the said Robert Gee and his successors the Allotment hereinafter described being part of the said one hundred and forty acres on Thornton Moor in lieu of the said Robert Gee's right of common in respect of his glebe land but inasmuch as the remainder of the said one hundred and forty acres was not equal to the value of or a full equivalent for the said tythes moduses compositions and other payments I with the consent of Sir John Lister Kaye Baronet the Patron of the said Rectory and parish church of Thornton and the said Robert Gee the Rector thereof purchased of Henry Alcock of Skipton in the said County Esquire at or for the price or sum of five thousand pounds all that messuage or tenement commonly called or known by the name of Windlefield or Earby Moor Side and comprising a messuage or dwellinghouse with two barns stable and other outbuildings thereto or nearly thereto adjoining and belonging and therewith occupied And also all those closes inclosures pieces and parcels of land arable meadow and pasture land hereinafter mentioned and commonly called and known by the names and containing the several quantities be the same or any of them more or less that is to say Great Rough Higher Rough and Lower Rough adjoining on the common or moor of Thornton formerly in one inclosure and containing in the whole nineteen acres and twenty nine perches formerly called Dawson Intack High Meadow with a barn therein five acres and three roods formerly Great Ing Higher or Upper Bank pasture six acres Lower Bank pasture seven acres two roods and eight perches and Bank Flat pasture two acres one rood and nine perches which the last two mentioned closes were formerly in one known by the name of the Lower Bank and are now again laid together Little Sinderhill one acre one rood and sixteen perches Greater Sinderhill four acres one rood and thirty six perches which hath lately been divided into two closes Cinder Hill Meadow one acre one rood and twenty five perches Wood Stead Field two acres one rood and six perches Wood one acre one rood and twenty eight perches Lane Bottom or Langber Bottom Field two roods and thirty one perches which the said three last mentioned closes were formerly in one and called the New Close three acres two roods and thirty three perches Limed Field three acres one rood and thirty five perches formerly called the Rake Bank Lane Field two acres one rood and thirty five perches formerly called the Rake Bank Ing Lane Field two acres one rood and thirty five perches formerly called the Rake Bank Ing All which said messuages buildings closes or pieces or parcels of land are now or late were in the occupation of William Sunderland and also all that other farm or tenement commonly called by the name of Clough Fiddling Clough or Fiddle Clough and comprising two messuages

OS maps back to 1853 on 6" scale all show Mill Lane and Dark Lane as walled/hedged tracks with a footpath alongside much of their length. The earliest (1853) 6" shows cottages along the north-western edge of Dark Lane adjoining the track to Marl Field together with other cottages immediately across the field. Traces of the cottages alongside Dark Lane are to be seen in the wall and two house platforms in the field adjoining the wall.

The David & Charles Sheet 16 reprint of the old series 1" OS map shows walled/hedged tracks as on the 1853 6" map but is not sufficiently detailed to show footpaths ,
~~although the relative importance of a route from Kelbrook above Moor Hall is apparent.~~

The 1825 Enclosures map of Thornton -in- Craven shows Mill Lane and Dark Lane as walled/hedged tracks but without footpaths alongside although many other footpaths are shown.

The 1956 OS 6" map shows the Urban District Boundary following along the edge of part of Dark Lane nearest the footpath , while a boundary marker is in the lane itself.

The inference is that , on the balance of probabilities , both lanes are old thoroughfares which have passed out of use due to narrow width and subsequent deterioration and have been partially replaced by a footpath alongside on the worst stretches.

In my own memory Mill Lane has always been passable at the Stoney Bank end for some 200 yds. , while the Mill Brow end was the access to allotments/hen-pens below the lane. Dark Lane has always been virtually impassable since my childhood.

A search of the schedule to the 1825 Enclosures Act for Thornton -in- Craven shows that neither Mill Lane nor Dark Lane are included in the list of public/private/high/bridle/occupation roads or tracks specified in the schedule , but since they are clearly shown on the map they must have been pre-existing.

There is no specific reference to Dark Lane in the schedule but Mill Lane is cited twice as an established boundary :-

(i) "- allot and award unto the Reverend William Roundell one allotment or parcel of land Number 71 on the said plan situate at Rake Bank Lane containing eleven perches , bounded by ancient inclosures on or towards the east and north , by Rake Bank Lane aforesaid on or towards the west , and by Mill Lane on or towards the south -" -I remember this parcel as a hen-pen on the other side of Stoney Bank Road from Banks Farm barn.

1) "- allot and award unto John Sunderland the younger and his heirs one allotment or parcel of land Number 16 on the said plan situate at Mill Brow containing twelve perches, bounded by ancient inclosures on or towards the east and south, by Mill Lane aforesaid on or towards the west, and by a road on or towards the north -"

-this plot has been built on probably earlier this century.

In both these allotments Mill Lane is obviously regarded as an established pre-existing boundary with the allotments located at each end of the lane on the western downhill side.

The lands on each side of these lanes are now and since the 1825 enclosures in different ownership with none of the owners having a claim to the lanes themselves.

We must assume on the balance of probabilities that these lanes have been thoroughfares in common use as far back and indeed before we can trace from the records.

There appears to be no reason why these lanes should not be cleared, drained, and suitably surfaced for use as public bridleways and the adjoining footpaths closed and returned to agricultural use in the ownership of the landowners on whose land they now run.
