Definitions for Voluntary Aided and Foundation Schools and Academies for Admission Purposes

The following terms used throughout this booklet are defined as follows, except where individual arrangements spell out a different definition.

DISTANCE

The 'straight line' method of measurement only applies for admission purposes. For transport 'walking routes' are used to determine distance.

PARENTS/FAMILY MEMBERS

A parent is any person who has parental responsibility or care of the child. Where admission arrangements refer to 'parent's attendance at church' it is sufficient for just one parent to attend. 'Family members' include only parents and siblings.

MEDICAL/SOCIAL/WELFARE

Where schools have a medical/social/welfare admission criterion then this should take into account the circumstances of the child and the family. Please note the Local Authority information in the main admissions booklet.

LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN & PREVIOUSLY LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN

The School Admissions Code [December 2021] states that within the oversubscription criteria, the highest priority must be given to looked after children and children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order).

This includes children who appear to the school to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted.

A 'looked after child' (1) or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption (2) child arrangements order (residency order) (3) or special guardianship order (4).

- (1) A 'looked after child' is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989) at the time of making an application to a school
- (2) This includes children who were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 (see section 12 adoption orders) and children who were adopted under the Adoption and Children Act 2002 (see section 46 adoption orders).
- (3) Under the provisions of s.12 of the Children and Families Act 2014, which amend section 8 of the Children Act 1989, residence orders have now been replaced by child arrangements orders.
- (4) See Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 which defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians).

Admission Authorities for faith schools may give priority to all looked after children and previously looked after children whether or not of the faith, but they must give priority to looked after children and previously looked after children of the faith before other children of the faith. Where any element of priority is given in relation to children not of the faith.

They must give priority to looked after children and previously looked after children not of the faith above other children not of the faith.

CHURCH ATTENDANCE

In the event that during the period specified for attendance at worship the churches have been closed for public worship and have not provided alternative premises for that worship, the requirements of these admissions arrangements in relation to attendance will only apply to the period when the churches have been available for public worship.

Each Lancashire Primary School and Academy has a published admission number which confirms its number of reception admissions each September. These will on occasion increase where strategic place planning issues allow and / or where decisions can be implemented in time for the effective co-ordination of the admission process.

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This supplement provides details of Community, Voluntary Controlled, Voluntary Aided, Foundation and Academy Primary Schools in the Lancaster, Wyre and Fylde areas.

The policy for admission to Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools is listed on page 4.

For Voluntary Aided, Foundation Schools and Academies a summary of the admission policy is provided in this booklet under the entry for each school. Some schools may operate different admission arrangements and you are advised to contact individual schools direct for clarification and to obtain full details of their admission policies.

These criteria will only be applied if the number of applicants exceeds the published admission number. A full version of the admission policy is available from the school and you should ensure you read the full policy before expressing a preference for the school.

Similarly, you are advised to contact Primary Schools direct if you require details of their admissions policies.

Admission numbers in The Fylde and North Lancaster districts may be subject to variation.

Where the school has a nursery class, the number of nursery pupils is in addition to the number on roll.

POLICIES ARE ACCURATE AT THE TIME OF PRINTING AND MAY BE SUBJECT TO CHANGE

Admission Criteria for Community & Voluntary Controlled Schools

When a school is oversubscribed on parental preferences, then the following priorities apply in order:

1. Looked after children or a child who was previously looked after, but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangement order, or special guardianship order or those children who appear to the school to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted, then
2. Children for whom the Local Authority accepts that there are exceptional medical, social or welfare reasons which are directly relevant to the school concerned, then
3. Children eligible for services premium, then
4. Children with older brothers and sisters attending the school when the younger child will start, then
5. Remaining places are allocated according to where a child lives. Those living nearest to the preferred school by a straight line (radial) measure will have priority.

The distance criterion will be used as the tie breaker if there is oversubscription within any of the admission criteria; it is a straight line (radial) measure.

If the Local Authority is unable to distinguish between applicants using the published criteria (e.g. siblings, those living the same distance from home to school, or families residing in the same block of flats) places will be offered via a random draw.

The distance measure is a straight-line measurement (radial) between the applicant's home address points and the address point of the school (co-ordinates provided by ordnance survey data).

When a primary school with a Geographical Priority Area (GPA) is oversubscribed the following priorities will be applied in order:

1. Looked after children or a child who was previously looked after, but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangement order, or special guardianship order or those children who appear to the school to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted, then
2. Children for whom the Local Authority accepts that there are exceptional medical, social or welfare reasons which are directly relevant to the school concerned, then
3. Children eligible for services premium, then
4. Children living within the school's Geographical Priority Area with older brothers or sisters attending the school when the younger child will start,
5. Children living within the school's Geographical Priority Area, then
6. Children living outside the school's Geographical Priority Area with older brothers or sisters still attending the school when the younger child will start then
7. Children living outside the school's Geographical Priority Area below.

The distance measure is a straight line measurement (radial) between the applicant's home address points and the address point of the school (co-ordinates provided by ordnance survey data).

If the Local Authority is unable to distinguish between applicants using the published criteria (e.g. siblings, those living the same distance from home to school, or families residing in the same block of flats) places will be offered via a random draw.

The distance measure is a straight-line measurement (radial) between the applicant's home address points and the address point of the school (co-ordinates provided by ordnance survey data).

Your child's school will receive over £1000 from the Government for every qualifying pupil. This funding is called 'pupil premium' and can be used by the school to improve pupils' attainment. Please register your eligibility so that the school can access this extra funding.

In addition, this grants additional entitlement for your child to:

1. Free school milk, if the school provides it
2. Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme
3. Low-income priority for Home to School Transport
4. Free school meals in Year 3 and above

Please note, you will still need to register your child with us even if you have an older child already attending school and receiving Pupil Premium.

Catching the School Bus

Quick Guide



Before the Bus Arrives

- Arrive 5 minutes early.
- Queue safely away from the kerb.
- Signal clearly to the driver.



Paying or Showing Your Pass

- Have your fare or valid bus pass ready. Valid passes must be shown on every trip or you will need to pay the fare on board.
- Lost or damaged passes? **Call 0300 123 6738.**
- Misuse of travel passes is treated very seriously.



On the Bus

- Sit and, where available, please wear a seat belt.
- Store bags safely.
- If all seats are taken you should stand sensibly behind the driver area.



Behaviour Rules

- No bullying or throwing items.
- No smoking or vaping.
- Respect others & the driver.
- If you misbehave you may have your travel pass taken away and be excluded from using the service.



Getting Off the Bus

- Never over-ride past the stops marked on your pass or the stop you have paid for.
- Press the bell for your stop.
- Take your belongings, including any rubbish & thank the driver.
